Annual Performance Report 2020/21

We are pleased to present the 2020/21 Annual Performance review of clinical research activities at Sherwood Forest Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust.

Research is an essential part of NHS care, not least because we know that organisations and teams that are 'research active' provide better care. In some circumstances research may be the only route for patients to access lifesaving therapy.

This year our focus has been on Urgent Public Health research. Our data has contributed to discovering new ways of treating COVID-19 and informing national policy. We were the 6th highest recruiting trust across the East Midlands region and 4th in the country compared to similar sized organisations. These figures highlight the increasing research profile at SFH which provides significant opportunities for patient engagement and contributes to the health of our local population.

It is with great pride that we are able to demonstrate an increase in research activity across SFH over the last 5 years.

This achievement has been realised by the expertise and dedication of our clinical and support department teams working across all divisions, alongside support from the East Midlands Clinical Research Network that funds a significant part of our team.

We would like to thank everyone for their contributions but most importantly we would like to thank the 3003 patients who took part in research this last year, without whom none of this would be possible.








