Escalated Risks and Issues	Accomplishments				
 Vaccine Supply – Challenges with AZ 1st dose vaccine supply nationally, unlikely to receive any AZ 1st dose vaccine supply until June 2021. KMH currently have 8,000 AZ 1st dose vaccines therefore continue to offer 1st dose appointments. Local Vaccination Sites focusing on 2nd dose vaccines, as Cohort 10 (over 40-45 years) continues to roll-out, KMH to offer 1st dose vaccines in addition to Clinically Vulnerable (Cohort 4) and Over 50's and bespoke cohorts including Pregnancy and Under 30's who can take AZ or Pfizer. Pathway agreed by programme to manage GP/Patient requests for Pfizer due to AZ JVCI and MHRA revised guidance. KMH HH awaiting confirmation of conversion to Vaccination Site – this will include migrating to National Booking System (NBS)for all 1st dose appointments, with Swift Queue running in conjunction to complete all 2nd dose appointments. Plan is for Swift Queue to support KMH with bespoke cohorts along with Booking Team service. KMH continue to support mutual aid vaccine supply to ensure vaccination sites receive supply timely and avoid vaccine wastage. 	 A record 5,977 people were vaccinated week commencing w/c 19.04.2021 KMH continues running multiple vaccines at KMH hub, accommodating 1st dose appointment around 2nd dose appointments providing a combined 1000 daily appointments. Hub opening hours during May Day weekend (1st – 3rd May) Communications confirmed – Staff Drop in services remains in place. Hub supporting system to ensure 2nd dose appointments brought forward due to clinical treatments are expedited timely due to challenges with vaccine supply at other sites. This includes support NUH due to planned hibernation of QMC site in May 2021. Q&A session with BAME colleagues took place on 22.04.2021 with FAQ information available on trust website.

Date	Incident Details	Incident Management
20 th March	Staff member approached nurse in charge to inform that he had sustained a needlestick injury after vaccinating a member of the public. Patient who was vaccinated has stated that the staff member sustained the needlestick injury immediately prior to him being vaccinated with the same needle.	The staff member advised that he had bled the puncture site and run it under water and covered with a plaster for protection. Individual advised to contact OH. Staff member has had bloods taken and Hep B booster administered. Patient has had bloods taken in Clinic 3, results pending.
28 th March	Patient was on his way out of the hospital after spending 15 minutes in the recovery area following the 2nd dose of the Pfizer vaccine. Patient felt dizzy and fell to the floor hitting his head on a door. No loss on consciousness.	Reviewed by the Dr, vital observations checked and within range. Advised to attend A&E for head injuries assessment. Daughter then escorted patient to A&E.
25 th March	Following administration of the 2 nd dose vaccine, pt. started to develop a red blotchy rash on her arms and back.	Reviewed by Dr at vaccination hub, cetirizine administered and 1litre of water given orally. Patient escorted to A&E for further observation.
25 th March	Patient developed blotchy red areas on hands and face following administration of the vaccine	Reviewed by Dr at vaccination hub, cetirizine administered with some good effect and 1litre of water given orally. Patient escorted to A&E for further observation and hen informed staff that he feels very itchy.
31 st March	Patient health assessed and discussed mild reaction with Duty Doctor. Patient happy to go ahead following advice. 5mls Cetirizine prior to administration of Pfizer vaccine (second dose). Following vaccination patient had a rash on both arms and began to feel itchy. Patient transferred to Emergency Department for review. Escorted by Healthcare Assistant.	Reviewed by Dr at vaccination hub, cetirizine administered with some good effect and 1litre of water given orally. Patient escorted to A&E for further observation and hen informed staff that he feels very itchy.

- The national programme has reported limited 1st dose vaccine supply for Astra Zeneca in May 2021 during Phase 2 of the vaccination roll-out. During the time KMH Hub will continue to focus on 2nd dose vaccines, and offer 1st dose appointments to Cohorts 1-10 Cohort 10 (up to over 40's). AZ vaccine supply good for May 2021. Multiple vaccines vailable da
- KMH hub 2nd dose allocation continues to be received on a weekly schedule.
- SFH are supporting the Local Vaccination Sites with mutual aid vaccine due to challenges with
 the timeliness of vaccine delivery from the national programme to the local sites, in addition
 to Bank Holiday schedule changes. The local sites are receiving push stock of Pfizer (arrives
 thawing) with expiry of 3.5 days, to avoid wastage KMH Hub are receiving the thawed vaccine
 and consolidating frozen Pfizer stock. KMH
- KMH continue to support system delivery with supporting bespoke cohorts including Clinically Vulnerable, Under 30's and pregnant Women.
- 1st dose appointments will be available with a seven day forward plan.
- Currently no plans for KMH to receive Moderna Vaccine.






Total Staff Vaccinated
