How to use the Ellipta inhaler

This leaflet will inform you how to use the Ellipta inhaler device correctly.



Only open the packaging when you are ready to begin using your inhaler. You should use your Ellipta inhaler within 6 weeks of opening.

Your Ellipta inhaler contains a 30 dose supply and is to be used every day; one inhalation once daily at the same time each day. The device is manufactured in a variety of colours, depending on which medication it contains.

Do not use your Ellipta inhaler to relieve a sudden attack of breathlessness or wheezing. If you get this sort of attack you should use a quick acting reliever inhaler (such as Salbutamol).

Only open the cover once you are ready to take a dose. If you open and close the cover without inhaling the medicine, the dose will be lost. To effectively use your Ellipta inhaler, follow this step-by-step guide:

- 1. Use only as prescribed.
- 2. Slide the cover down until you hear a click.
- 3. While holding the inhaler away from your mouth, breathe out as far as is comfortable.
- 4. Put the mouthpiece between your lips and close your lips firmly around it.
- 5. Take one long, steady, deep breath in and hold this breath for at least 3-4 seconds.
- Remove the inhaler from your mouth and breathe out slowly and gently.
- 7. Slide the cover upwards as far as it will go to cover the mouthpiece.

Please note:

- It may not be possible to taste or feel the medicine, even when using the inhaler correctly.
- Do not shake the inhaler, block the air vents with your fingers, or breathe out into the inhaler.
- The dose counter will count down by one unit at a time.
- If the dose counter does not count down as you hear the click, the inhaler will not deliver the required dose. If this happens take the inhaler back to the pharmacy.

If your inhaler contains a steroid medication, remember to rinse your mouth afterwards to prevent soreness.

How to store your Ellipta

Keep in a clean and dry place, away from the reach of children and pets. Always refer to the manufacturers guidelines.
