Executive Summary

The aim of the COVID-19 vaccination programme is to protect those who are at risk of serious illness or death should they develop COVID-19, and reduce transmission of the infection, thereby contributing to the protection of population health.

The paper provides an overview of the contributions the Trust has made to support the Nottingham and Nottinghamshire COVID-19 vaccination programme.

The details of the vaccinations issued to date are summarised in the attached slides. The Summary highlights to date are:

- KMH Hospital Hub successfully converted to Hospital Hub+, currently one of eight Trusts nationally to support Phase 3 of the vaccination programme. Phase 3 will commence in September 2021.
- Over 113,000 vaccines have been administered at KMH Hub since programme commenced in December 2020
- Over 6,000 bank and substantive colleagues have had a vaccine with 479



- outstanding. Work continues to support vaccine hesitant colleagues.
- During August 2021 the Hospital Hub will support the vaccination programme for clinically extremely vulnerable children aged 12- 16.
- There is a significant programme of work across Nottingham and Nottinghamshire to ensure all those aged over 18 are offered a vaccination. Support programmes have been put in place to respond to vaccine hesitancy. This has involved; a mobile bus, pop up vaccine centres, targeted work with the local authority and offering vaccines at places of employment. Walk in appointments have been effective in increasing the uptake.
- Planning for Phase 3 of the programme and transition into that throughout August 2021 has commenced.
- Kings Mill Hospital Hub will continue to support health and care worker and citizen booster vaccinations throughout Phase 3.
- The resource hub, hosted by Sherwood Forest which supplies the flexible workforce for the vaccine programme continues to grow, with over 5,000 colleagues recruited. These colleagues have provided an excellent service and many will continue to work on Phase 3 of the programme and in other health and care settings going forward. The resource hub and team have been shortlisted for a national Healthcare People Management Association (HPMA) award.

Recommendation

The Trust Board is asked to take assurance from the report and to note the significant contributions made by colleagues at Sherwood Forest to enable the successful delivery of vaccinations to the citizens of Nottinghamshire and colleagues working at Sherwood.
