**Executive Summary** 

A flu letter was received on 17 July 2021 from Public Health England and Department of health and Social Care, containing details of the National flu immunisation programme for 2020/21.

The letter states that modelling indicates the 2021/22 influenza season in the UK could be up to 50% larger than typically seen and it is also possible that the 2021/22 influenza season will begin earlier than usual. The letter states that all frontline health and social care workers should receive a vaccination this season which should be provided by their employer, in order to meet their responsibility to protect their staff and patients and ensure the overall safe running of services. The letter states that the vaccine uptake ambition for 2021/22 for healthcare workers is 100% offer with an 85% uptake ambition.

The Board of Directors are asked to take assurance from the paper and support the approach planned for the 2020/21 HCW flu vaccination programme, and how the Trust is meeting the expectation of national requirements associated with flu.
