PHOSP-COVID Improving long-term health outcomes

This is a Research study to determine short and long term effects of COVID-19: physical, psychological and social impact. It also looks at associations between long-short-term outcomes, patients demographics, genetics and socioeconomic status.

This is a data collection study for previous COVID-19 inpatients at SFH.

CCP-CANCER UK

Look out for this new UK study which has been launched to assess the impact of COVID-19 on people with cancer.

It will run over 12 months and will examine questions that are important for the care of patients with cancer.

The study will also determine COVID-19 infection and mortality rates in people with different types of cancer, as well as those receiving different treatments, by collecting and analysing patient data.

Research Champions

The purpose of a research champion is to improve awareness and promotion of clinical research, increase patient's opportunity to take part in research and improve departmental working relations. This links in with the trusts CARE values and the 2 year vision.

The Research Champion role is now an official link role. It involves helping to identify suitable patients for research studies in your area. Full training is provided and updated annually. This will provide our patients with wider opportunities to participate in research, helping to benefit future treatments and outcomes. The Research Academy is BACK!


My name is Jill and I have worked on the Critical Care Unit (CCU) for nearly 20 years.
