#### Chairman Report - June 2018

# General update

In the last month the key issues I have been focusing on are:

- Refreshing the Mid-Nottinghamshire Better Together programme. The revised governance arrangements and strengthened transformation programme come into effect from the end of June and there will be regular progress reports to Boards;
- A week of celebrations for Volunteers' Week and the 70<sup>th</sup> birthday of the Mansfield and Sutton League of Friends, the last of these celebrated at Welbeck Abbey at kind invitation of Alison Swan Parente MBE who is President of the League of Friends;
- Discussions around the future arrangements of the Nottinghamshire Integrated Care System and how the two Integrated care Provider Alliance in Greater Nottinghamshire and Mid Nottinghamshire.
