## **Executive Summary**

**Local Negotiating Committee** 

From August 2017 all junior doctors in training have moved to the new 2016 junior doctors' contract. The Guardian of Safe Working Hours report provides detail of the exception reports received from August 2017 until the end of April 2018, particularly concentrating on the information relating to the last quarter. The report shows where trends are emerging with regard to exception reporting and makes recommendations about further work that is required to provide more information for the Guardian of Safe Working Hours and ongoing support for both the junior doctors and consultants regarding the exception reporting process.
