Q3 Sherwood Forest Hospitals Charity

The Community Involvement Team offered support to various fundraising groups and individuals undertaking fundraising activities on behalf of the charity.

189 monetary donations were received by our community involvement team.



187 donations to the general and specific funds

2 donations to the dementia appeal

These include:

- A final presentation of £11,212 from the King's Mill Voluntary Services Fundraising Group to the dementia care appeal. The group have raised a total of £76,000 from fundraising stalls held in the main entrance for the Woodland Ward project.
- £650 from Antony Lyons who took part in a "Tough Mudder" event and donated to the Dementia Care Appeal.
- £434 from Gwen Smith who took part in a sponsored head-shave for cardiology services.
- £422 from Garry Watkinson and son Liam who took part in a sponsored walk to raise funds for the neo-natal unit.
- £701 from volunteer Vicki Wilson and members of the Nottingham ladies past captains' golf society to the Welcome Treatment Centre.

Q3 Fundraising Partner Activity

The Community Involvement Team offered support to our fundraising partners with the following activity:

The Friends of Newark Hospital

- Donation of £3307 to purchase an Airpal patient transfer device for the CT Scanner Department.
- Donation of £600 to purchase mobile privacy screens for the Therapy Services team at Byron House.
- Donation of £1950 to purchase a wireless LED surgical headlight for the breast surgery team.
- Donation of £3,000 to the newly refurbished Urgent Care Centre to support art work and extra activity items for the children's area.

The Amazon Breast Support Group

The Amazon fundraising group celebrated 20 years of fundraising and support of the Breast Care Services at King's Mill Hospital. Committee members, local fundraising groups and sponsors of the group met with breast care nurses, consultants and staff to celebrate the fantastic achievements of the group. During the event Weight Watchers made a donation of £300 to the group.

Q3 Voluntary Services Activity

- Volunteers at Sherwood Forest Hospitals Trust have been commended for their support after carrying out a total of 915 years volunteering between them. Long service medals and certificates ranging from 5 to 40 years were presented to 73 volunteers by the Acting Trust Chair, Dr Peter Marks.
- Volunteer of the Year Award at the staff excellence awards went to Jane Combes who was nominated by Assistant Chief Operating Officer Hayley Allison who said "Jane works in many areas in Newark Hospital and her commitment and support are gratefully received from patients, visitors and staff, her enthusiasm for her role has not waivered in 37 years!"
- Former volunteer Mrs Lyndsey Foster went on to gain employment following a volunteer placement on the maternity ward at King's Mill Hospital. Lyndsey is now a student midwife and continues to receive support, encouragement within the trust and thanks the voluntary services staff and patients all of whom have made her feel welcome and at ease.
- 192 volunteers completed an enhanced update training programme including fire, falls, safeguarding, information governance and infection control.
- 82 prospective volunteers registered an interest in the voluntary services scheme.
- 11 new starters joined the service and there were 25 leavers.
- 30,326 people viewed the Trust's Community Involvement posts on social media.

- Christmas events and donations
- For the sixth year running 500 children from 16 local schools entertained visitors, patients and staff at our hospitals during the lead up to the festive season raising over £600 for our charity.
- Fundraising volunteers at King's Mill Hospital held an autumn raffle draw raising £1186. Volunteers are currently fundraising for the refurbishment of the parent's room on the children's ward. This project is also being supported by Pentagon Motors.
- The Friends of Newark Hospital and the League of Hospital Friends (Mansfield and Sutton) funded Christmas presents for patients who were in hospital during the Christmas period.
- Patient Christmas parties were held at Newark and Mansfield Community Hospitals
- Starlight Panto Troupe performed Dick Whittington for the children on Ward 25.
- The League of Friends (Mansfield & Sutton) held a Christmas Fayre at Mansfield Community Hospital raising £711.
- The Friends of Newark Hospital held a Christmas raffle raising £1,400.
- Generous Christmas donations were received from Morrisons, Sainsburys, Blood Bikers, Mansfield Town Football Club, Mason's Arms, Gap Outlet, Nat West Bank, Auto 100 and Lisa Slaney donated a selection of Christmas gifts and children's toys to the children's ward.
