## Sherwood Forest and Health Education England unveil £120,000 investment

The postgraduate dental training suite at King's Mill Hospital has become one of the first post-graduate centres in the world to offer dentists the very latest in virtual reality training.

SFH, in partnership with Health Education England – East Midlands, has invested £120,000 in three simulators as part of plans to establish the East Midlands as a centre of excellence for simulated dental training. Up to 100 dentists – a combination of newly qualified individuals and those wishing to refresh skills and techniques – are expected to use the technology every year.

Our three Moog Simodont dental trainers offer high-resolution, three-dimensional images combined with a dentist's drill hand piece that gives realistic computer controlled feedback, recreating the sensation of working on real patients.

## Sherwood Forest Hospitals Charity donations pay for £47,000 surgical X-ray equipment

We are extremely grateful to everyone from the community who has given to Sherwood Forest Hospitals Charity following the installation of a £47,000 mini c-arm X-ray machine. This will allow surgeons to take X-rays from almost any angle as well as view live images during orthopaedic and podiatry procedures. It will reduce the need for a radiographer to be present and for patients to have to return for follow-up X-rays, making our service more efficient.
