Executive Summary

The IG Toolkit is due to be submitted on the 31st March 2017. The overall compliance is 'green satisfactory' with an initial score of 80%. It is envisaged this score will increase as standards leads upload further information.

An internal audit completed by 360 assurance offered 'significant assurance' with regards to this submission, the small number of actions raised in this report are currently being implemented

Over 4,500 members of staff have completed Information Governance training since 1st April 2016. Over 1,600 members of staff were trained face to face and over 2,800 were trained on-line as of February 28th 2017. There are also a number of staff due to renew their on line training before the end of March 2017. These figures would support the Trusts requirement for 95% of all staff trained.
