#### **CHIEF EXECUTIVE'S REPORT**

### 1. Monitor Activity

Routine weekly meetings with Monitor continue with the main focus being assessing progress towards developing a Long Term Partnership with another Trust. The Chief Executive's report will update the Board on progress in this respect.

#### 2. National Communications

All Trust Boards have received a joint letter from Jim Mackey and Professor Sir Mike Richards which asks that Boards consider quality and finance on an equal footing in their planning decisions.

The letter highlights that in due course, Monitor, together with the CQC and NHSE will be publishing revised National Quality Board Staffing guidance, and a new metric looking at care hours per patient day, as part of the CQC's assessment on use of resources. Details are expected in the coming months.

The letter referred to is in the Reading Room.

Trusts have also received letters from NHS Improvement highlighting their indicative share of the £1.8bn sustainability fund. This support has a number of conditions attached and details will be provided in the Chief Financial Officer's report to the Board.

Trusts should expect final recommendations from Lord Carter's review into operational productivity in late January/early February. This report is likely to outline the essential steps that are necessary in order for the NHS to generate the target £5bn efficiency savings by the end of the current parliament.

Trusts have also received a letter from NHS Improvement outlining additional arrangements to tackle agency costs. The Director of HR will outline these arrangements in the Board meeting and the letter is in the Reading Room.
