Detail:

Close oversight of available capacity by specialty is monitored weekly to ensure Newark appears on the choice list for patients. New models of care have been implemented to ensure the best use of resources, for example a nurse specialist in ophthalmology has been introduced to follow up patients post-surgery to free consultant time to see new patients.

Full integration of KMH and Newark governance and booking arrangements to improve access for people of Newark. Better session and in-session utilisation and growth in outpatient, day case and diagnostic volumes.

The orthopaedic service continues to plan for expanding its hand/wrist/foot/ankle services to expand at Newark. More specialist foot/ankle and hand/wrist surgery will commence from July 2016.

The range of Medical Day-Case procedures at Newark have been expanded, SOPs have been developed and staff have been trained to deliver a wide range of procedures not previously offered, improving the patient experience and reducing the need to travel.

Scoping work is underway to identify possible partner arrangements with NUH for the introduction of new service provision.
