CHAIR'S REPORT

Regulatory Activity

The PRM scheduled for August was cancelled and the PRM scheduled for 16th September has also been cancelled, NHSI are currently suggesting a date early October and this is being arranged with the required attendees.

Long Term Partnership

It was confirmed by the NHSI that the future form of the new organisation will be an NHS Trust and this has been communicated to staff, governors and stakeholders.

There are on-going discussions with NHSI to consider the detail required with regard to due diligence and the impact this may have on the timeline.

Governors

There was a governor development session on the 17th August which was facilitated by Ernst & Young and which provided the governors with further detailed background of the advantages of the merger and the work which was already being progressed in terms of short term support. Keith Girling presented the clinical perspective and this was well received by the governors. The presentation also reminded the governors of their statutory role in the process.

Membership & Engagement

There were no membership events in August as in previous years these have not been well attended due school holidays.

I was pleased to attend the Governors Membership and Engagement Committee, where we had a very useful discussion on how to ensure that the new organisation continues to benefit from the strong engagement and experience of the existing governors going forward.
