Urgent Care

Update

- Department renamed, new signage installed
- Official opening of the new department/service 21st December by MP Robert Jenrick
- Liaison with Nottinghamshire County Council Highways Department regarding roadway signage to Newark Hospital
- Re-affirmed the range of minor injuries/illness and moderate illnesses that can be safely treated
- On 5th December, four Ambulatory Care Pathways introduced for Cellulitis, Anaemia, Social Admission, and Accidental Overdose. These will reduce the numbers of patients that require a transfer to an acute site
- Out of Hours GP service now co-located with the SFH team
- Ongoing work with partners in developing a primary care led Urgent Care Centre. Planning for appropriate utilisation of Vanguard funding to support development of primary care hubs






Urgent Care

Activity

There were 21,780 attendances to Newark Hospital MIU during the period 1st November 2015 - 31st October 2016, an increase of 1,106 attendances (5.08%) compared to the same time period of the previous year.







Update

- Additional surgical lists implemented in trauma & orthopaedics, vascular, and ophthalmology.
- Equipment procured via league of friends to deliver an extended range of breast surgical procedures
- Expansion of the range of medical daycase procedures provided
- The ten session theatre schedule is now full, with specialties allocated to each session
- Introduction of a pain service, clinic and procedures
- Increased outpatient capacity to meet demand, including delivery of evening and weekend outpatient clinics






Outpatient Activity

Outpatients attendances to Newark Hospital during the period 1st November 2015 - 31st October 2016 were 75,838 showing an increase of 5.77% compared to the same time period of the previous year, increases seen in both New and follow up attendances.

Outpatient attendances to Newark Hospital






Outpatient Activity

Diagnostics

- Nerve conduction studies introduced
- Increased capacity in Cardio-respiratory services
- Maintained capacity across radiology diagnostic tests, flexibly utilised to offer patients choice of location





Beds

- 2016 Audit demonstrated equal split between subacute medical patients and pure rehabilitation on Sconce Ward
- Agreement to maintain sub-acute medical repatriations and step up admissions
- Audit on acuity currently being repeated
- Focus on increasing utilisation of Fernwood for rehabilitation patients, working in partnership with Nottinghamshire Healthcare Trust local partnerships Integrated Care Teams

- Media coverage of the launch of the Urgent Care Centre
- Ambulatory services publicised to local clinical services
- Ongoing engagement and 'Choose Newark' presentations to stakeholder groups in Newark & Sherwood, and border areas (South of Nottingham and Lincoln)
