Subject: Scheme of Delegation Update

Date: 26th March 2015

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Executive Summary:

The Scheme of Delegation (SoD) was fully updated and presented to the October 2014 Board of Directors meeting for ratification.

A couple of items have since come to light that need consideration of further amendment to the SoD.

1) Financial limits for Divisional Nurse Matrons to reflect the budgetary and operational hierarchy:

To accurately reflect budgetary responsibility, only one budget holder (£50k limit) is allocated per cost centre, and this is currently assigned to Nurse Matrons for their ward(s).

However, as Divisional Nurse Matrons have responsibility for nursing budgets for their respective division, and Nurse Matrons report to them, it is proposed that the SoD provides for Divisional Nurse Matrons to also be allocated the £50k limit instead of the current £10k limit (as 'other authorised signatories').

The additional authority would be inserted into the SoD Table B, Section 7.1 - Revenue Expenditure.

2) Termination forms:

Internal Audit have raised a concern about the authorisation of termination forms as there is no specific reference in the SoD.

It is recommended that line managers are allocated this authority and that reference to this is added to the SoD in Table A, Section 33f) – Establishments.

The proposed changes have been endorsed by the Executive Team and approved by the Audit and Assurance Committee.

Next Steps:

Following ratification by the Board of Directors an updated SoD will be issued.
