

In order to locate this information we would need to review individual patient records for the last 6.25 years this would be a minimum of 194 records. We have estimated that we can locate and review 4 patient records per hour. We estimate that the cost of satisfying your request will be £1,212.50 (48.5 hours x £25 per hour).


