Minor contrast extravasation

During your visit to the Breast Unit today you were given an injection of contrast medium (an x-ray dye). This was a necessary part of the examination.

Unfortunately, not all of the injection went into the vein; a small amount went into the tissues around your vein. This is called extravasation.

You may experience some tenderness, swelling or redness around the site of the injection. This can last for around one to two days and should resolve without any treatment.

To help speed up the recovery:

- Keep your arm raised and gently massage the area to help reduce any swelling.
- Apply a cold compress to the area.

We would like to know if you are experiencing any symptoms so we will call you tomorrow.

If you notice any of the following, please call the Breast Unit on 01623 622515, extension 3226, for advice:

- Numbness or tingling of the lower arm or hand.
- Increasing redness or blisters at the injection site.
- Increased pain that does not get better over time.
- Unusual coolness of the lower arm or hand beyond the injection site.
- Any increase in the size of your arm.
