### **Q1 Sherwood Forest Hospitals Charity**



The Community Involvement Team offered support to various fundraising groups and individuals undertaking fundraising activities on behalf of the charity.

**190** monetary donations were received by our Community Involvement Team to the general and specific funds.

- 72 donations to the general and specific funds.

#### National Volunteers Week - 1 - 7 June 2018

### New volunteer engagement event
