

OVERVIEW OF EDUCATION PLACEMENTS, PARTNERS AND WORK EXPERIENCE PROVISION AT THE TRUST

OVERVIEW

The Trust enjoys a very strong reputation as a leading education and training provider in the region and constantly receives excellent feedback from students undertaking placements at the Trust. One of the commonest comments that is fed back to the Trust is that students actually want to spend longer on placement here as they enjoy it so much, which is a great testament to our workforce who enable this to happen.

Due to the changing educational landscapes and the removal of the nursing bursary many universities nationally have seen a reduction in students enrolling onto pre-registration nursing courses. Our students are our future workforce and giving them the best possible and most enjoyable experience at the Trust is pivotal if we want them to apply for permanent positions at the Trust once they have qualified.

In 2018 the Training, Education and Development Department (TED) has expanded its nursing placement provision to include two new education partners, Sheffield Hallam and Derby Universities both of whom have students based locally and want to work at this Trust. Both universities have agreed to recruit a cohort of students specifically for SFH which is quite unique and increases our ability to recruit to our future workforce.

The team actively promotes inter-professional learning as part of its provision and took 48 third year pharmacy students who completed a one day insight placement on a variety of wards. The Trust is the largest provider of these types of inter-professional learning placements in the area.

The TED Department works closely with all HEI's by attending their open days to attract future nursing students by actively promoting the educational experiences that SFH has to offer. The quote below is very typical of the feedback that the Trust receives from its students

WORK EXPERIENCE

The Trust was delighted to become host for the NHS Work Experience Hub for Nottinghamshire on 1 April 2015. The Hub provides a centralised process for those seeking work experience placements as well as for those organisations wishing to provide a placement.

The work experience project continues to provide a 'one stop' shop for work experience which has hugely benefitted the whole of Nottinghamshire in supporting the future talent and succession planning agendas. Attracting the future workforce is a key priority of the Trust and the system.

The total number of work experience applications received for the Nottinghamshire system in 2017/18 was 1,206 which is an increase of 8% on the previous year. The project has exceeded its target of 680 placements by 17.94% with 802 placements attended in 2017/18. There was also a 4% increase of BME applications compared to 2016/2017 and 74% of pupils survey stated that they still wanted to work in the NHS after completing their placement.

A total of 168 work experience placements were based at SFH during 2017/2018 in a range of clinical and non-clinical areas. Work experience placements requests come from a range of young and mature people who are thinking of their future careers and want to experience a placement before deciding to pursue it further. Placements can last from a few days to a few weeks and are available in clinical and non-clinical settings.
