Main Theatres, Patient Escort Services	<p>Students will observe a variety of supporting services but may not directly observe operations. This will not hinder the students' learning and appreciation of this area.</p> <p>Students observing Theatre Patient Escort in Theatres will get a good overview of the patient journey to and from Theatres, including some of the following activities:</p> <p>Observation of verbal and written checks to keep patients safe. For example, checking consent is correct, flagging any alerts such as allergies or infections. Observation of the use of the ORMIS system which records each step of the patient's journey to theatres, in theatres, in recovery and back to the ward. Observation of how beds and equipment are prepared for patient transfers out of theatre.</p> <p>Students will see how theatre lists are organised on a daily basis and how the emergency list runs. Students will have the opportunity to talk to patients directly. Students may also observe transfers of specimens to the lab and how blood is prepared for transfusion. Research Nurse Nottingham Respiratory Research Unit (NRRU) Respiratory Clinical Research Facility (CRF)/ Biomedical Research Centre (BRC)	<p>The NRRU is one of the leading respiratory research units in the UK with state of art facilities and equipment. Our organisation is collaboration between Nottingham University hospitals NHS Trust and the University of Nottingham. We work closely with pharmaceutical companies on new drug trials.</p> <p>We see patients with a variety of respiratory conditions including Asthma and chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD) as well as some more rare breathing disorders.</p> <p>The placement would involve working with one of our experienced research practitioners in our unit. You would be able to observe patients who are taking part in a clinical trial attending for their visits. The visits would usually involve sample collections, heart tracings (ECGs) and a large variety of breathing tests as well as observing patients receiving new innovative drugs. We collect data and are required to input this into various systems.</p> <p>We have a team of scientists in the unit who process a variety of samples including Blood, Sputum, Nasal and Lung tissue; you would be able to observe the collection and processing of samples during your placement.</p> <p>We would discuss the fundamentals of research, the history and why it is so important in moving science and medicine forward.
