# **Q3 Sherwood Forest Hospitals Charity**

The Community Involvement Team offered support to various fundraising groups and individuals undertaking fundraising activities on behalf of the charity

265 monetary donations were received by our Community Involvement Team totalling £176,298.66

- 85 donations to the general and specific funds
- 178 donations to the gamma scanner appeal
- 2 donations to the Newark Breast Cancer Service Appeal

# **Q3 Voluntary Services**

# During Q3:

- 70 prospective volunteers registered an interest in the voluntary services scheme
- 12 new starters joined the service and there were 12 leavers (majority of leavers due to other family commitments)
- The Chairman's Long Service Awards recognised 85 volunteers for over 1,100 years' service. Awards ranged from 5 years to 40 years.
- The Community Involvement Hub volunteers won the Volunteer of the Year Award at the Staff Excellence Awards in November.



# **Q3 Community Involvement Activity**

- The official opening of Sconce Ward took place in October followed by an open morning for donors and fundraisers.
- Over 20 local Schools visited King's Mill and Newark Hospitals to sing Christmas Carols in the Main Entrances.
- Work has commenced in the garden Courtyard at King's Mill Hospital in partnership with Flowerpod (Nottingham Trent University)
- The team supported Christmas jumper day across the 3 sites
