<b>Clinical Genetics/ Medical Experience</b>	<p>Students will spend time in the department with both doctors and genetic counsellors. The attachment will involve attending consultant clinics as an observer and the chance to discuss a career in clinical genetics. Depending on the timing of the placement, there may also be the option of attending medical meetings to find out more about how the department works and observing discussions around difficult cases.</p> <p>Applicants should be aware that we offer a highly specialised outpatient service only and therefore this placement is not suitable to help applicants decide whether they wish to pursue a career in medicine.
