Chair's Report - July 2020

Covid-19

Covid-19 continues to take up much of the Board's time as well as the Trust as a whole, and it will be discussed in more detail elsewhere in the meeting. The Board in particular is actively thinking about the impact of the decisions the Trust has had to make on patients who may not have had their treatment in recent months as a result of changing activity, and how we continue to support them.

We are also conscious of the disproportionate impact of Covid-19 on BAME individuals and will continue to help lead the Trust in how we make sure BAME colleagues and patients are supported at this time.

I would like than again everyone involved in the response to Covid -19 both from within SFH and from our partners. We know that the number of patients we have at the moment has reduced, but ongoing work to restore and reform services continues to be very complicated, whilst continuing to manage the ongoing Covid situation.

Sherwood Forest Hospitals' annual baby remembrance service

Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, Sherwood Forest Hospitals' annual baby memorial service will be streamed online on Thursday 16 July.

The service will include a selection of poems, readings and prayers. Also, as done in previous memorial services, members of the Chaplaincy Team will release white doves as a mark of remembrance.

We hope that the service will be as meaningful and supportive to you and your families as possible, particularly during this challenging time. This year's virtual service will be a safe place for bereaved families to remember their babies together, and will be a comfort and virtual support network for families who would usually connect face-to-face during the service. We hope that we can hold our usual service in the Faith Centre and remember the babies together later in the year.

SFH Doctors Awards

For the first time this month SFH is holding an award ceremony recognising our Doctors. Our first ever Doctor's Awards have been launched to celebrate clinicians who go above and beyond the call of duty and who have made a positive impact on our services, patients, visitors and colleagues.
