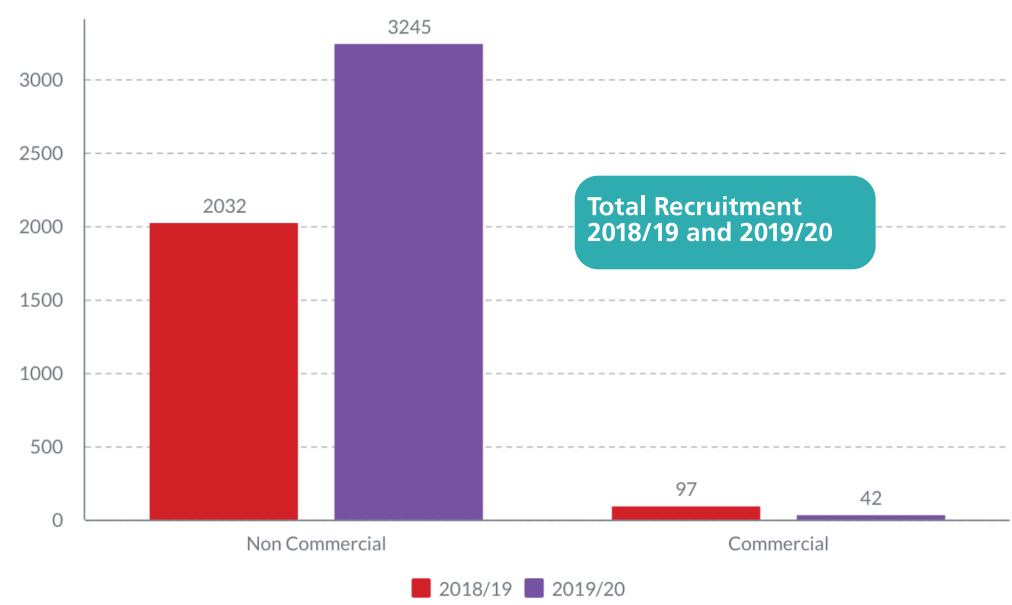
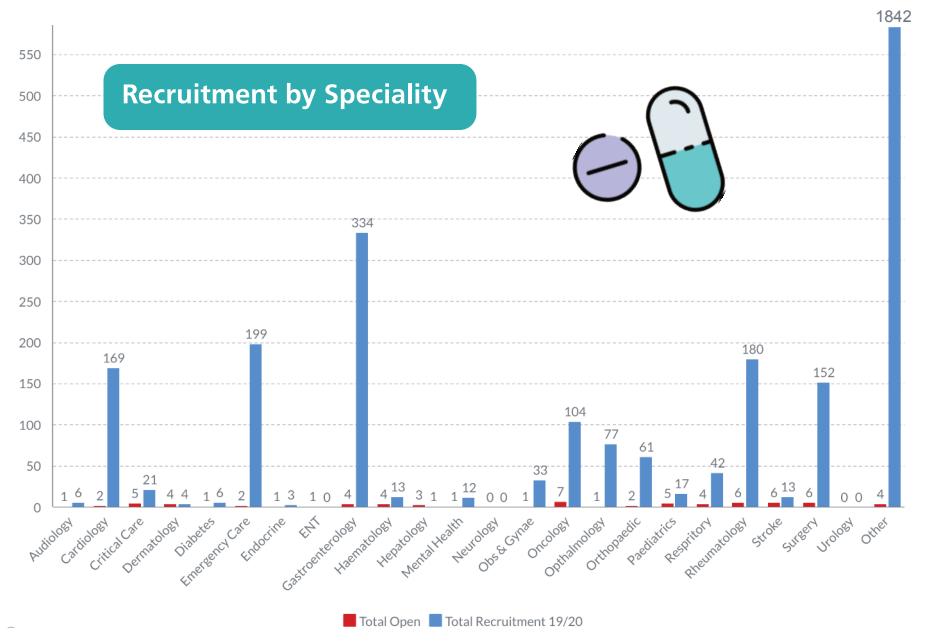
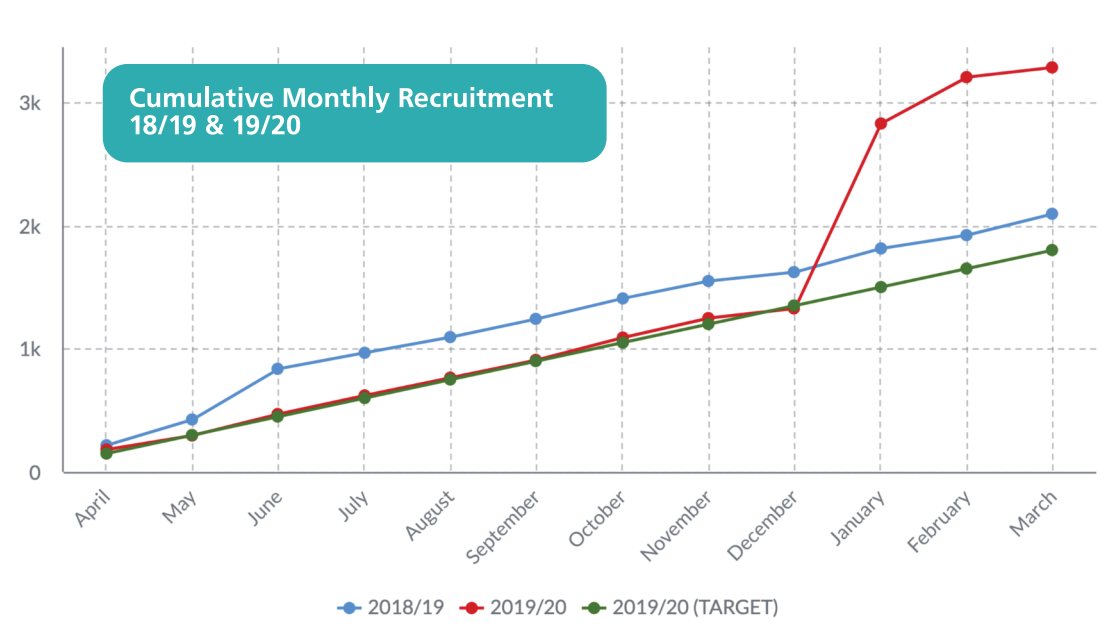
We are pleased to present the 2019/20 Annual Performance review of clinical research activities at Sherwood Forest Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust.

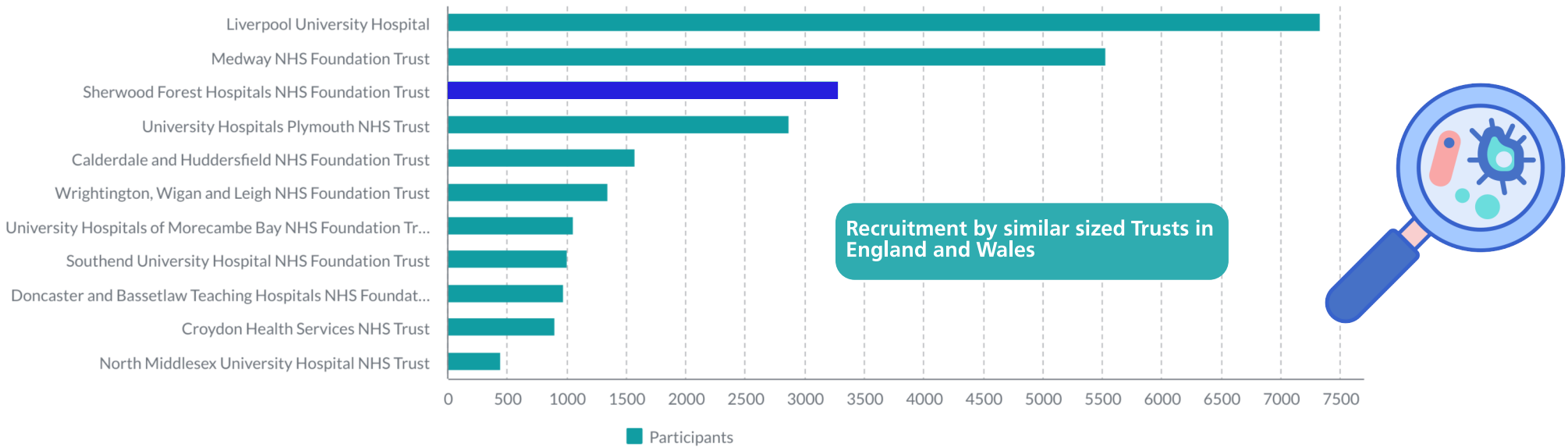
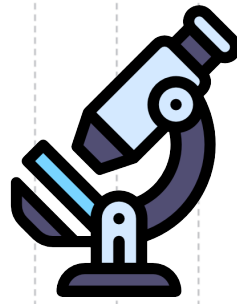
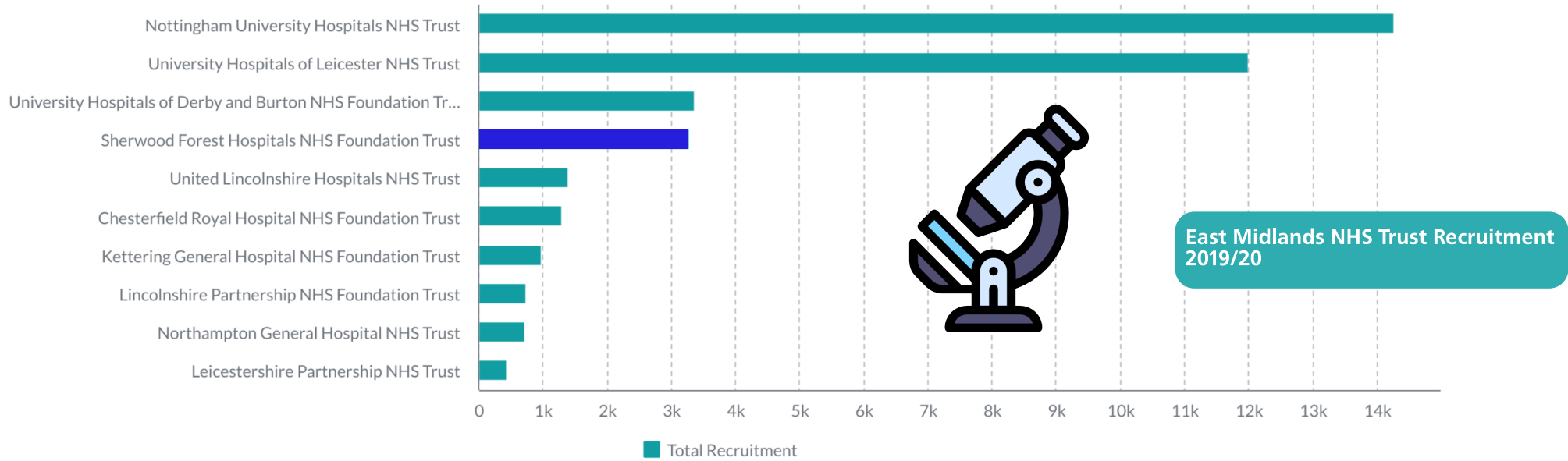
Research is an essential part of NHS care, not least because we know organisations and teams that are 'research active' provide better care. In some circumstances research may be the only route for patients to access lifesaving therapy.

It is with great pride we are able to demonstrate a year on year increase in research activity across SFH since 2017. Last year we were the 4th highest recruiting Trust across the East Midlands region and 3rd in the country compared to similar sized NHS organisations. These figures highlight the increasing research profile at SFH which provides significant opportunities for patient engagement and contributes to the health of our local population.

This achievement has been realised by the expertise and dedication of our clinical and support department teams working across all Divisions, alongside the support from the East Midlands Clinical Research Network that funds a significant part of our research team. We would like to thank everyone for their contributions but most importantly we would like to thank the 3,281 patients who took part in clinical research last year. Without these volunteers, none of this would be possible.

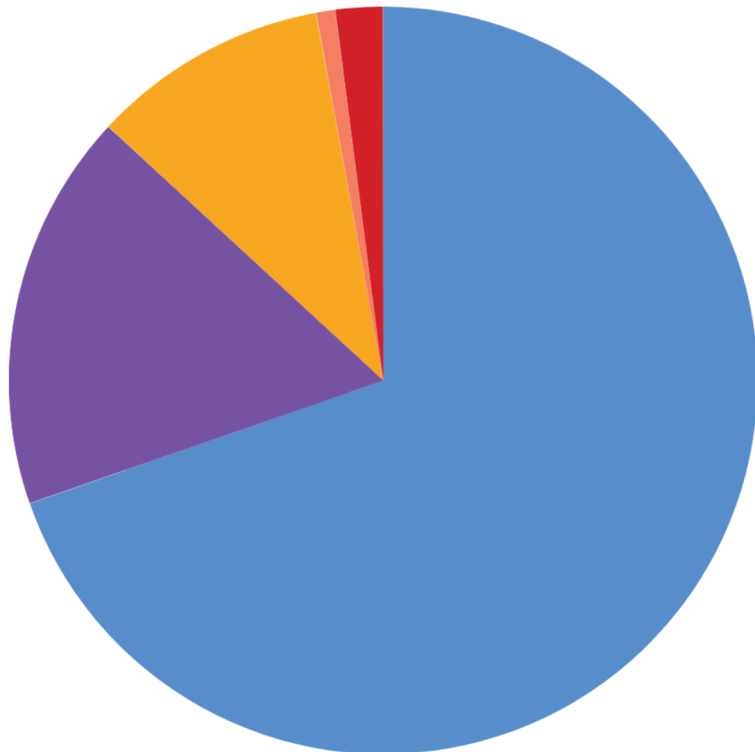

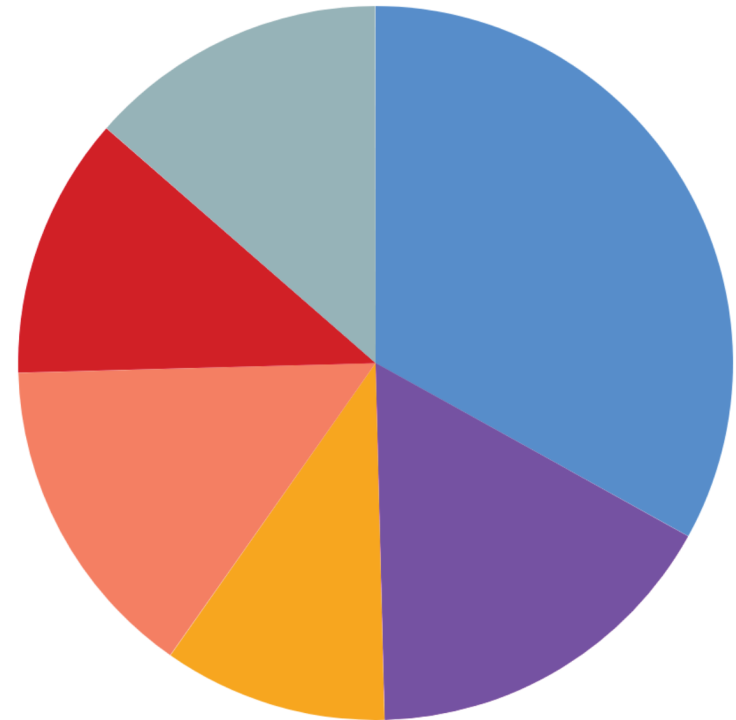
