Executive Summary

The Constitution was last reviewed in 2014, therefore it was agreed to undertake a thorough review of the Constitution to ensure it was fit for purpose in 2020.

A working group comprised of seven public and staff governors and the Director of Corporate Affairs was established to take the review forward. The determined changes to be made include:

- The removal of any reference to co-opted governors the view of the group being this had been tried and was not successful and is not a route the governors would wish to pursue in the future, preferring publically elected substantive governors.
- The public constituencies have also been changed, to incorporate the Derbyshire constituency into the Rest of the East Midlands and increase the number of governor for the Rest of the East Midlands from one to two, the working group thought this appropriate as there was confusion as some areas of Derbyshire were included in the Derbyshire constituency and some in the Rest of East Midlands, it hoped that through combining all of Derbyshire into the Rest of the East Midlands constituency members will have more clarity.



- The requirement for two partnership governors was amended to one
- The Volunteer class for staff governors has been removed and replaced with an appointed volunteer governor.
- The number of staff governors for Kings Mill Hospital and Mansfield Community Hospital has been reduced from three to two
- The number of staff governors for Newark Hospital has been reduced from two to one
- A further section 7.13.2.6 has been added to the Roles and Responsibilities of Governors section.

The standing orders for the Council of Governors have been amended to reflect the above changes.

The standing orders for the Board of Directors have been reviewed and updated in some areas but no significant changes.

As the amendments to the Constitution include changes to the constituencies and roles of the Governors, the revised Constitution must be presented to the Annual Members Meeting on 28th September for final approval by the membership.

Changes to the Constitution must be approved by both the Council of Governors and the Board of Directors before presenting to the Annual Members meeting and submitting to NHSI.
