Charities Commission registration:

"The principle objective of the charity is to provide additional support to the patients of Sherwood Forest Hospitals.

This is achieved by the prioritisation of needs and the granting of expenditure on items such as refurbishment, medical equipment and staff education/welfare"



#### **Overview**

SFHFT is the sole corporate trustee. The Board has delegated management authority to the Charitable Funds Committee.

Charitable Funds Committee:

3 x Non-Executive Directors, Chief Finance Officer, Director of Corporate Affairs, Deputy Chief Nurse, Head of Financial Services and Community Involvement Manager.

Governor observers appointed.

Adds an extra dimension to the care we proudly offer our patients, visitors and staff.

Play a constructive and vital part of the Trusts community engagement initiatives and act as ambassadors for the Sherwood Forest Hospitals Trust and Charity

- Circa 400 volunteers
- 235 enquiries in 2022/23
- 110 new volunteers recruited in 2022/23

All volunteers are recruited in line with SFH Trust Process (DBS, interview and induction, training)



#### **Motivation**

Volunteers also provide ad-hoc assistance for events and initiatives such as the Menopause Conference, Walking Aid Amnesty and Mealtime Audits.
