Membership and engagement group Quarterly report

July 2022

1 Background

Over the past two-and-a-half years the focus has been on member engagement as opposed to recruitment. A conscious effort has been made to collect more member email addresses in order to streamline member communications, with members being given an opportunity to identify their preferred methods of communication and engagement, either through active or observing member status.

Work has been ongoing to build representation and increase engagement in the 16-22 years age group with collaborative working links being forged with local colleges and education providers, as it has been noted that members aged 16 to 25 make-up just 1% of the trust's membership (126 members).

Demand for our services remains high, however, and we are working hard to address waits for elective and planned treatments after many non-urgent cases were paused as part of our response to the pandemic.

2 Member communications and engagement

2.1 Meet your Governor sessions

In March 2020 all face-to-face member engagement was suspended. These sessions were reintroduced in May 2021 as outside events, in-line with the current COVID-19 restrictions. An indoor session was held in November. However, these meetings were suspended due to rising cases. Following the lifting of restrictions, Meet Your Governor events have been reinstated indoors w/c 20 June 2022. Further monthly dates are in the process of being arranged.

Anril

During April, there were no Meet your Governor sessions at King's Mill Hospital or Newark Hospital.

May

In May there were no Meet your Governor sessions at King's Mill Hospital or Newark Hospital.

June

In June there were five Meet Your Governor sessions held at King's Mill Hospital and there were two sessions held at Newark Hospital.

Overall, the comments taken at both sites were a mixture, but mainly positive.

Trust Matters

Editions of Trust Matters were issued electronically in April Open rate: 19%, May Open rate: 18%, and June Open rate: 16%.

2.1 Member engagement

We continue to work to improve membership from under-represented groups, particularly the under-50s, men and people from ethnic minorities. We need to hear from every part of our community and are working with local colleges to increase representation from younger people.

A meeting took place between Deb Dowsing, Rich Brown and Shirley Higginbotham to discuss a strategy going forward for membership. The potential to send out a letter to members without emails in order to gain their email addresses was discussed and Deb is looking into costs for this. Also discussed was a separate youth membership and newsletter, and the possibility of linking up with the Training & Education Development and Care4Notts to make us aware of visits to schools and colleges so we can attend these events to promote Trust membership.

Shirley is waiting to hear back about some potential changes to the Constitution, so we are unable to progress with any plans until we hear the outcome of this.

2.2 Member communications

Trust Matters continues to be sent electronically to members monthly. The average open rate is around 19%.

3 Representation

The current public membership total stands at 14,194.

Overall analysis of gender, age group, ethnicity, socioeconomic groupings and constituencies revealed the following:

- Gender Males are still the most underrepresented gender with a total of 5041 male members across all constituencies.
- Age group 16–21-year-olds are the most under-represented age group. The total number of members in this category is 33.

- Ethnicity Members of mixed ethnicity are currently the most underrepresented with a total of 27 members from this category.
- Analysis of membership by constituency shows that the most underrepresented areas are, Out of Trust Area and the Rest of England.

Current breakdown by area is:

4,322 – Mansfield 4,205 - Ashfield 3,295 – Newark and Sherwood 2,208 – Rest of East Midlands 40 – Out of Trust area 124 – Rest of England

4 Membership forward plan

As stated, the current focus for communications is on operational issues relating to the current surge in Covid-19 cases in the community and the subsequent increase in admissions to our hospitals. There is, however, an acknowledgement that the Trust needs to continue with its wider stakeholder and partner engagement as soon as practicable.

The next edition of Trust Matters is scheduled to go out 28 July 2022.
