With reference to your request for information received on 29th December in which you asked:

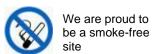
- 1. How many admissions related to drug overdose for year 2022?
- 2. How many admissions related to drug overdose from January to November 2023?
- 3. What are the most common drug overdose cases admitted in your hospital?
- 4. How many patients admitted for drug overdose received medical treatment at a ward level 2022?
- 5. How many patients admitted for drug overdose received medical treatment at a ward level Jan Nov 2023?
- 6. How many patients admitted for drug overdose required admission to the intensive care unit for advanced medical intervention such as mechanical ventilation and continuous renal replacement therapy in 2022?
- 7. How many patients admitted for drug overdose required admission to the intensive care unit for advanced medical intervention such as mechanical ventilation and continuous renal replacement therapy in January November 2023?
- 8. What is the average length of stay for those patients admitted for drug overdose in your intensive/critical care unit?
- 9. What is the total number of deaths related to drug overdose in your hospital in 2022?
- 10. What is the total number of deaths related to drug overdose in your hospital Jan-Nov 2023?

Clarification of drugs received on 02.01.2024. All drugs over the counter, prescription or illicit.

Please accept our sincere apologies for the delay. I can confirm in accordance with Section 1 (1) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 that we do hold the information you have requested.

Section 12 of the Act allows the Trust to refuse to deal with any requests where we estimate that responding to the request would exceed the cost limit. We have identified that question 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 will exceed the cost limit. For public authorities the cost limit is £450 (18 hours). If responding to one part of a request would exceed the cost limit, we do not have to provide a response to any other parts of the request. Therefore, the estimated cost of processing your request is £1250.00. This charge has been calculated in accordance with section 13 of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 and the Freedom of Information Fees Regulations.

In order to locate this information for questions 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 we would need to compare over 800 drug codes with a number of different intention codes. We would also need this information to provide you with the answer to questions 7, 8, 9 and 10. We have estimated that it would take in excess of 100 hours to gather this information. We estimate that the cost of satisfying your request will be £1250.00 (50 hours x £25 per hour).

Under section 16 of the Act we are obliged to advise you to refine your request to narrow the scope in order to bring it within the appropriate limit. Can we suggest that the timescales for question 8 are reduced, for example, to a calendar month. If the timescales are reduced to a month, the Trust will be able to respond to all of your questions. If you are unable to reduce the scope of the request the Trust will be unable to continue processing your request until the fee is paid. If you wish to proceed with this request the fee will need to be paid within three calendar months. If the fee is not received by this date, I shall take it that you do not wish to pursue this request and will consider the request closed.

Should you have any further enquiries or queries about this response please do not hesitate to contact me. However, if you are unhappy with the way in which your request has been handled, you have the right to ask for an internal review. If you are dissatisfied with the outcome of the internal review, you can apply to the Information Commissioner's Office, who will consider whether we have complied with our obligations under the Act and can require us to remedy any problems. Generally, the Information Commissioner's Office cannot decide unless you have exhausted the internal review procedure. All information we have provided is subject to the provisions of the Re-use of Public Sector Information Regulations 2015.
